ABSTRACT

This study explored and analyzed the social adjustment among Christian-Muslim intermarriage in Abar 1st, San Jose City, Nueva Ecija as it assessed issues and the factors that helped the adjustment process in terms of religious differences, food and parenting. The researcher conducted the study among selected Christian-Muslim couples. The study used in-depth interview and field observation method to determine the different issues and factors of social adjustment encountered by the Christian-Muslim couples. The study revealed aside from the three issues specifically mentioned which are religious differences, food and parenting, there are four additional sources of adjustment like clothing, the side of Christian wife and having another wife. While the factors of social adjustment are as follows; a) orientation of the husband; b) acceptance of the family; c) Orientation of the community; d) respect for each other and lastly; e) the self-adjustment. The study showed that social adjustments among the respondents had been difficult because of the changes that they deal with on a daily basis especially the wives who had been converted to Islamic religion. However, the present condition of the four couple respondents was all better than when they started to adapt as couples of different religions. The wives already adapted some of the culture of the religion they are part of and, as they claimed, still there's room for adjustments.
